

No Greater Name CG Guide: Apha & Omega

1. When you look at the world right now, what issue makes you most angry, afraid, or confused? (share briefly, don't get caught in the weeds, and speak kindly to one another)

2. Read Mark 13:5–8. Why does Jesus warn us not to be alarmed even when the world feels like it's unraveling?

3. Read Revelation 1:8 and Revelation 21:3-8. What does Jesus mean when He calls Himself “the Alpha and the Omega”? Do you believe this? How would you explain it to a non-believer or seeker?

4. Read 2 Peter 3:7–11, Job 14:5, and Psalm 139:16. How do these passages deepen your confidence that Jesus holds your days, your future, and the final outcome of history?

This question anchors the truth:

- God sets the limits of human history (2 Peter 3).
 - God sets the limits of your personal life (Job 14).
 - God wrote every one of your days before you lived a single one (Psalm 139).
- Together, what do they tell us about Him and this life?

5. Which of these do you need to practice most right now: trust, hope, or assurance? What would it look like to live that out this week?

- Trust — open-handed obedience
 - Hope — courage in uncertainty
 - Assurance — confidence in identity and eternity
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Final Thought:

We started tonight by naming the things that make us angry, afraid, or confused. Those things are still real — but now we can see them through a different lens.

You don't face them as someone tossed around by the times. You face them as someone held by the One who is the Alpha and the Omega. The world may still feel chaotic, but you don't have to be in chaos. Your life is not controlled by your algorithm but by the Author of all things. Because He holds the beginning and the end, you can walk confidently in the middle.
