God's Unique Vision:

Within God's general vision, we each have a unique calling in how God's vision is expressed in our lives. How we witness or make disciples, how we worship, where we worship, how we reach out and love others, and even how The Holy Spirit manifests himself in and through us look different.

3. Discuss the process of seeking God's unique vision for your life

Did you Seek God First?

Begin each day in prayer and meditation. Your vision must align with God's purpose for your life. Spend time in His presence, listening more than speaking.

Did you write It down?

Habakkuk 2:2 instructs us to "Write the vision and make it plain." There's power in putting your vision on paper. It makes the intangible tangible.

Did you seek Godly counsel?

Seek wise counsel who will pray with you and encourage you in your vision. Be selective – not everyone will affirm God's vision for your life. Jesus often shared the deeper meanings of His parables only with His disciples.

Is it outwardly focused?

Your vision is not just about you. It's about the lives God wants to touch through you. It's about the kingdom's impact He wants to make through your obedience. Whether your vision involves building a ministry, raising godly children, starting a business that employs and blesses others, or serving in your community – your vision matters.

Are you afraid to be wrong?

Be willing to hear NO. Sometimes, we get it wrong when discerning things, and we may get it wrong sometimes. Don't quit; assess, learn, pivot, adjust, trust, and take heart. Seeking God's direction and vision is a huge part of living out God's vision.

Are you facing opposition to God's vision?

When you begin to pursue your God-given vision, you will face opposition. Joseph had a vision, and his own brothers threw him into a pit. Daniel had a vision, and he was thrown into a lions' den. Jesus had a vision of redemption, and He faced the cross. Opposition is often confirmation that you're on the right path. The enemy doesn't want God to win in your life.

Truth Moment: If we are not actively seeking God's plan, we are on our plan.
